The Holz family was welcomed to Valley with open arms and it didn't take long for word to get out that Mr. and Mrs.

Holz had daughters.

Fast forward a few years, Denny is now dating Dawn and after a few years of courtship, the couple married in Valley in 1965. In the meantime, Terry becomes best friends with local girl Jerri Thompson. Ed, finding the energetic personality of Jerri irresistible, were also married in 1972 in Valley, WA.

Throughout the years the Dawson/Holz families have remained very close. This close knit family has felt a connection to Valley so much so that the desire to live anywhere else never crossed their minds. In fact, the family welcomed a new member when Terry married Bruce Wilks in 1987.
