General Rules and Regulations

- Exhibitors will give the necessary attention to their exhibits and, at the close of the Fair, take charge of same. Fair
 officials will take reasonable precautions, but will not be responsible for loss or damage.
- The Fair Association reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle all
 matters, questions, and controversies that arise out of, or in connection with the Fair. The Fair Association reserves
 the right to accept or reject any entry for any reason.
- Professional entries will be accepted, but exhibitors must identify level of professionalism on entry tag. A professional
 is a person who has had more than one year of professional schooling or makes a living selling their product.
 Professional entries will be judged, but will not be eligible for a "Grand Champion" or "Best of Show" awards.
- A combination of the DANISH and AMERICAN system of judging will be used for all exhibits. All exhibits will, first, be judged using the Danish system Each exhibit is judged whether they meet or exceed certain standards.
 - BLUE Given to those who most nearly meet the highest standards established for the particular class or level of performance. Blue does not indicate perfection or superiority, but indicates a high degree (90% -100%) of achievement towards the elements in the standard.
 - RED These entries rank good (80% 89%) in relation to the standards or expected achievement. Either the
 general level of accomplishment is less than excellent or enough shortcomings are found to cause the placing
 to drop from excellent to good.
 - WHITE The white grouping contains entries found lacking and rate only an average, acceptable, or satisfactory rating for the standards established.

After judging with the Danish system, they are judged using the American system, giving the top scoring entries a grand/reserve grand placing. The judge's decision is final.

- Both youth and adult exhibitors will receive premiums. Premium rates will be posted at the Fair Office.
- Any exhibit entered, but not listed in the Fair Book, will be classified and points awarded if the exhibit merits such points.
- Judges in any division may not judge their own work.
- ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITS MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED! Exhibit Hall entries register on Friday morning prior to the Fair (see schedule of events).
- When mailing in your animal entry, please attach a completed Liability Waiver. Each form must be postmarked NO LATER THAN August 1 to:

- No premiums are mailed. Please come to the fair office between 3:00pm and 5:00pm Fair Day for premium payout.
- Exhibits may be removed after 4:00pm, and must be removed by 5:00pm on Fair day. The Fair Association will not be responsible for any display or exhibit left in the building after 5:00pm. Lost and found items should be reported to the Fair Secretary, Carla Scott.

NOTE: Each exhibitor is entered into a drawing to receive a prize from a local business. Names are drawn at 2:30, 3:00, 3:30, 4:00, and 4:30pm. Exhibitors must be present to win. If you have entered an item into the fair, stick around and see what you may win!

Animal Health Requirements

All animals exhibited must meet the health requirements listed below:

- 1. Other than cats and dogs, Washington animals require no vaccination or test for entry.
- 2. No animal will be admitted on fairgrounds after showing begins without veterinarian signature on Veterinarian
- 3. Fair Veterinarian will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry to determine that they are free from infectious or contagious disease and ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be aware that ringworm, warts, pink eye, strangles. contagious eczema, scabies, lice, mites, ticks and fleas fall into these categories.
- 4. No animal from any quarantine area or premises will be permitted to enter.
- 5. All out-of-state entries must comply with the State of Washington Import Regulations. A health certificate will be issued by an accredited veterinarian from the state of origin for all out of state livestock and poultry entries.
- 6. The Fair Veterinarian's professional decision as to the health status of an animal will be final and will be upheld by the Valley Fair Association.
- 7. In the event that the health status of an animal is determined after the veterinarian has left the premises, the department supervisor will make final determination if the animal must be disqualified.

Educational posters must be registered on the Friday prior to Fair Day by 12:00noon.

- Animals must be on the grounds, ready for vet check before entering stalls/pens by 7:30am on Saturday (Fair Day).
 Judging begins at 8:00am.
- For animals requiring proof, please present rabies certificate to veterinarian at vet check
- Classes listed in the Fair Book are open to all entries, including 4-H and FFA.
- Exhibitors may enter more than one animal, but will receive premiums for no more than two (2) classes per animal. No exhibitor may enter more than one animal in any section, and no animal may be used for more than one section, except for pens of three.
- All animal exhibitors are expected to keep their stalls, pens, cages, and areas presentable at all times.
- Stalls/pens must be cleaned before premiums will be paid! Horse exhibitors must clean around trailers.
- Exhibitors must check in with Department Supervisors. If exhibitor is entering animals in different departments, they will need to check in with each Department Supervisor.
- Animals must stay within their department during fair day.
- Exhibitors must indicate if they are 4-H, FFA or Open on Stall Cards.
- 4-H ANIMAL EXHIBITORS MUST ENTER FITING AND SHOWING!
- Any animal exhibit may be used for judging contest.
- If there are fewer than three (3) animals in a class, only ribbons may be awarded.

All children must be accompanied by an adult. Do not leave small children unattended around animals

Subsection: List breed

- Dogs three months of age or over, must show evidence of rabies vaccination. It is strongly recommended that all dogs, for their own protection, be vaccinated against DHLP and Parvo.
- Exhibitors will be responsible for keeping their allotted area clean. Dogs must be on a leash at all times unless benched. Any feces shall be disposed of properly.
- Any dog that causes a problem with other dogs will be excused from the fairgrounds.
- Exhibitors are limited to one dog per class. If an exhibitor wishes to show 2 dogs in 4-H classes, the dog that is entered in Fitting and Showing must be entered in one of the obedience classes. The second dog may be entered in a different obedience class, or the second dog may be entered in Open Division, instead of 4-H, but can't be entered in both divisions.
- Refer to 4-H publication, EM4796 for rules.
- Do not confuse Open Division with Open Obedience
- Beginning novice is for exhibitors who are beginners, with no previous experience, whose dogs have not had previous training.
- Pre-Novice is for exhibitors who have had previous training or new members whose dogs have had previous training.
- No wolf, wolf-hybrid, or other wild animal crosses may enter.
- Dogs in season will be allowed to exhibit, but must wear doggy britches, and will go last in obedience classes.
- Divisions within the same class may be combined for long sits and downs but will be judged separately.
- Please join us for a DOG AGILITY DEMONSTRATION given by dog exhibitors at 1pm in the dog department area.
